CARRYING THE MESSAGE TO TREATMENT FACILITIES

Millions of Alcoholics come from treatment and recovery facilities each year but never make it to the support groups or rooms of Alcoholics Anonymous. Many of the facilities are over crowded and staffed with dedicated caregivers who lack the means to provide support to these patients upon their release. The result many times is that of a revolving door for the Alcoholic who doesn't have the tools to resources to continue on the journey of recovery. However, service is alive and thriving in Amarillo Texas. On April 19, 2009, the District III Area 66 Treatment Facility Committee held a very successful workshop to address these serious issues. The Chairperson Julie M. and her committees' dedication to serve helped them to organize the workshop and brought together over 50 AA

members, and Treatment Facility Directors and Staff, District Committee Members and most important-Newcomer! Many AA members were not aware of the opportunity to do 12 Step work in treatment facilities. This workshop also provided a much needed open forum for Treatment Facility Directors and Staff to express their dire needs and gratitude for A.A.'s bringing the message of recovery into their facilities.

The workshop began with a showing of the Conference approved film "HOPE", followed by talks from AA members who had been in treatment facilities and upon discharge continued their recovery program in Alcoholics Anonymous. The speakers explained how the principles of the steps and promises of the AA

recovery program and the health and spiritual while in a treatment facility. A presentation was also given on how the Treatment Facility Committee functions within our Twelve Traditions. The workshop ended with questions from the "Ask it Basket" and answered by the District Committee Members.

The hard work and commitment of the Committee made this workshop a success. I have appreciated serving Alcoholics Anonymous in this capacity and look forward to continuing to work with the District III Committee.

On the night I was born according to my parents a symphony of gunfire and bullets could be heard emanating from a confrontation between traffickers of illegal alcohol and border patrol agents....

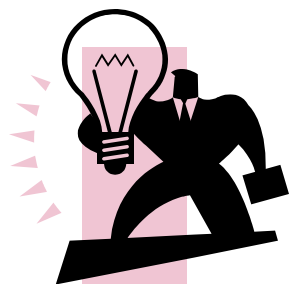
The author of this story Jose G. M. passed away on March 22, 2009.
